


Bible Study – Grade 9

²"What shall I do for you?" he asked. "Tell me, what have you got at home?" "Nothing at all, except a small jar of olive oil," she answered. ³"Go to your neighbours and borrow as many empty jars as you can," Elisha told her, ⁴"Then you and your sons go into the house, close the door, and start pouring oil into the jars. Set each one aside as soon as it is full."

⁵So the woman went into her house with her sons, closed the door, took the small jar of olive oil, and poured oil into the jars as her sons brought them to her. ⁶When they had filled all the jars, she asked if there were any more. "This is the last one," one of her sons answered. And the olive oil stopped flowing.



It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. ⁶ But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no roots. ⁷ Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. ⁸ Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop – a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. ⁹ Whoever has ears, let them hear."
